To be eligible for enrollment in the Child and Family Advocacy Clinic (CFAC), students must complete this form and return it to Gwenn Jones (gmjones@camden.rutgers.edu) as soon as possible.

Students may earn 4 credits for summer clinic. Students enrolling in CFAC for the summer session must also be able to attend a “boot camp” from 9 AM to 4 PM at the beginning of the semester depending on availability of other students. If attendance at this session is not possible, the professor may be able to make other arrangements.¹

Due to the nature of working with victims of child abuse and neglect, additional background information is required of potential CFAC students. Information disclosed on this form will not necessarily disqualify students from eligibility to enroll in CFAC.
